A quick note on business calculus

"What was Japan like when Newton was active?"



Calculus was established in Europe in the 17th century, but what was it like in Japan at that time?

In 1689, five years after Leibniz published his Thesis on Calculus, Matsuo Basho set out on a journey along the narrow road. In 1704, Newton announced the results of calculus Theory of Quadrature. The time is the Genroku era of Tokugawa Tsunayoshi, the fifth Tokugawa shogun. Calculus was established in Europe during the Genroku era, when people wore topknots and enjoyed the culture of the Genroku era, making a great contribution to the history of mathematics. "Double-entry bookkeeping" used in accounting is said to have been invented by Lucapaccioli in Italy in the 15th century.
